Being Helpful

Recipe

Cinnamon Apple Chips

2 apples 1 tsp. granulated sugar ¼ tsp. cinnamon Pinch of nutmeg

Wash and thinly slice the apples (adult only). The core can either be left as is or removed with an apple corer or knife. Be sure to remove all of the seeds.



Invite your child to help measure and mix the sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg in a small bowl. They can also help place the apple slices onto a parchment-lined baking sheet in a single layer. Then, sprinkle the sugar and spices on top.

Bake in a 225°F oven for 1½–2 hours, until crisp. Cool and enjoy the crunchy snack together!
